geons, whether they have been in his Majesty's service, or not, shall be in the capacity of ensigns.

All persons desirous to engage, are to enter their names in the month of April, 1749, at the Trade and Plantation office, or with the Commissioners of the Navy residing at Portsmouth and Plymouth.

Omitted in the article of Cape-Breton.

The French people transported from Louisbourg to France (including the Vigilant's men) preceding July 17, 1745, 4130, whereof 1822 via Boston, and 76 via New-Hampshire. The French, while in Boston, were allowed in old tenor per week, viz. an inhabitant from Cape-Breton 20 s. a failor 15 s. captain of the Vigilant 51. second captain 3 l. each officer 40 s.
