Mr. Armour and his partner will hold controlling interest in the big company. The enterprise was brought about primarily by the competing attitude assumed by the American Cotton Seed Oil Trust company toward Armour & Co., and other lard manufacturers.

THE new roller flour mill at Shoal Lake, Man., has been completed, and was put in operation last week.
