Volva present Annulus wanting		Volvaria— Some edible—one variety sus- picious.
	Gills free from stem 	Pluteus—Several of the Genus are edible P. Cervinus is one of our earliest, persistent, plentiful, delicious species. Distinguish from Eutoloma by its free gills.
	Gills Adnate or sinuate (curved or waved)	Entoloma—Caution Dangerous—many known to be poisonous. Separate from other rose-spored Genera by its sinuate gills.
No Annulus or No Volva	Gills decurrent 	Stem fleshy Clitopilus— Agrees with Clito- cype in the white- spored series. Some of the best edible finds are within this Genus. A few are unpleasant raw; none poisonous.
	Gills at first adnexed or ad- nate but readily separating	Stem with Cartilaginous rind Eccilia— Qualities not given.
	Gills free or adnexed and not decurrent	Leptonia—rare Qualities not given. Nolanea— Qualities not given.
