

II. For every load consisting as is above mentioned, taken up on Mr. Drummond's Wharf, or between that and the King's Wharf, and carried to any part of the Lower-town, not farther than the House in *Sault-au-matelot* street, commonly known by the name of Cadet's House, there shall be paid for the carriage thereof twenty coppers, and for every puncheon of melasses taken up and carried the aforesaid distance one shilling and three pence.

III. For every load consisting as aforesaid, taken up in the Lower-town on the King's Wharf, or between that and Mr. Lymburner's Wharf, and carried to any place between Cadet's House and the Palace, there shall be paid for the cartage thereof thirty coppers, and for every puncheon of melasses carried the same distance one shilling and eight pence.

IV. For every ordinary load as aforesaid, taken up between the King's and Mr. Drummond's Wharf, and carried to any place beyond Cadet's House as far as the Palace, there shall be paid for the carriage thereof one shilling and eight pence, and for every puncheon of melasses carried the same distance two shillings.

V. For every hundred bushels of wheat taken up and carried within the limits mentioned in the first article there shall be paid two shillings, and for every hundred bushels of salt taken up and carried within the said limits there shall be paid three shillings and nine pence.

VI. For every hundred bushels of wheat or salt taken up and carried within the limits mentioned in the second and third articles, the price shall be increased in proportion as on other goods mentioned in the said articles.

VII. For every cord of wood taken up in any part of the Lower-town and carried to any other part of the Lower-town, there shall be paid for the carriage thereof one shilling and six pence.
