Q. Were you doing duty on board the Leopard at the time of the controverly between her and the American frigate Chelapeake?

A. Yes.

Q. Relate to the Court what you know respecting

the charges against the prisoner?

A. When I went on board the Chelapeake, I saw the prisoner standing, or leaning, against one of the carronades on the quarter-deck.—I know he was taken out of the Chesapeake to the Leopard.

The prisoner having no questions to ask, the evi-

dence Withdrew; and

Mr. James Simpson Wells, Clerk of the Halifax, called in, and fivorn.—He produced the complete book of the Halifax—twore to its correctness, and, by direction of the Court, pointed out to the Judge Advocate, the five men, stated by the charge to have deserted, which he did as follows:

Richard Hubert, failmaker, born in Liverpool,

England, aged 22.

Henry Saunders, yeoman of the sheets, born in

Greenock, aged 26.

Jenkin Ratford, ordinary, born in London, aged 34. George North, captain of the main-top, born in Kinfale, aged 27. William
