WARD FOUR CONSERVATIVES HOLD SUCCESSFUL BANQUET

Toronto Representatives in Parliament Predict Near End of Reign of Graft.

Ward four Conservatives gathered on Saturday night in Victoria Hall and listened to lively speeches by local representatives in parliament.

Edmund Bristol, M.P., said that the political history as "a government of grafters," and the North Atlantic Trading Company, with dozens of other sister scandals, would be the evidence.

In the limelight, Hon. Dr. Pyne, responding to the toast of "The Ontario Legislature," stated that the fact of being in the limelight of public view had not in any measure robbed him of his own self-respect.

He believed more patriotism, loyalty and love of country and the flag should be taught in all our schools, and he hoped to see the United States and every schoolhouse in this province.

W. K. McNaught, M.L.A., said there was a volume of hidden meaning in the inscriptions on the doors of the parliament buildings of Ottawa and Toronto.

Major Cotterworth, Aid. McChie and Greig and Controller Hubbard made felicitous speeches in answer to the toast, "The Mayor and Corporation," and expressed their confidence in the present Ontario government.

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

HAMILTON GETS SNAPT BY ANOTHER REFORM WAVE

Police Catch Twenty-Five Chinamen Playing Fan Tan and Mix-Up in Names Follows.

Hamilton, March 17.—(Special).—Another wave of moral reform swept over the city to-day, when an alleged gambling den was raided and twenty-five Chinamen arrested and an alleged illegal resort "pulled."

The newly-appointed constables were out searching for violations of the Liquor Law.

The raid on the Chinamen took place between 3 and 4 o'clock this afternoon, when Sgt. Major Prentice, with five constables, surrounded Lee Gue's grocery store. The call was unexpected, and the police claim to have found about twenty-five Chinamen and one white man, Victor Beach, a waiter, most of whom were engaged in playing the rascally game of fan-tan.

They were loaded into the patrol wagon and taken to cells, where bail was fixed at \$100 for the keeper and \$20 each for the alleged frequenters. Nearly all including the keepers, were able to furnish the money.

The arrival of the police created great excitement, but they crept in so quietly and had the place so well surrounded that none of the inmates escaped. The captives look so much alike that the police got some of them entered in the wrong cell.
