HAVE THEIR OWN MAP.

Board of Health Will To-Day Put the New Sanitary Law Into Operation.

THIS MAGISTRATE WAS SLOW.

Smallpox Masquerading as Grip—Contradictory Replies From Sanitary Officials.

The meeting of the Ontario Board of Health yesterday was a marked contrast to that which assembled so calmly early in February, and was suddenly broken up by a war map hung on the wall. The battle centres were depicted by red waters. The lurid map with its spots of red and yellow, which smallpox prevailed. The whole day was occupied with reading reports almost exclusively upon this epidemic. A curious occurrence was noted regarding the outbreak at Sudbury. The Provincial Board had having heard several cases of smallpox at Sudbury, wired the police magistrate on Feb. 11 for information. On the following day, Feb. 12, Dr. Bryce received a telegram from the mayor of Sudbury, asking him to come at once, as the local doctors had reported several cases of smallpox. On the next day, Feb. 13, a telegram from the police magistrate was received here, saying that there were "two mild cases of smallpox at the American Hotel." Dr. Hoggatt started on Feb. 13, and arrived at Sudbury the next day, when he found that the epidemic was well advanced. He was accompanied by Dr. S. J. Hoggatt, who had been summoned from South Ste. Marie, had found eight cases of smallpox, and placed them in the pesthouse, the epidemic having been scattered throughout the town for a week under the guise of grip. The epidemic was reported to be the worst for 20 years in the town. It was reported to be in lumber camps, in unorganized districts, but without proper sanitary regulations. The board will today arrange for the enforcement of the new regulations for unorganized districts, enacted by the Legislature.
