DR. LANGRILL, MAN OF IDEAS

New Medical Health Officer Presents a Report Full of Important Recommendations

MEETING OF MARKETS COMMITTEE.

Chief Smith Took a Load Off the Economical Members-General City News.

Hamilton, May 6.—(Special.)—Dr. Langrill, the new medical health officer, at the meeting of the Board of Health this evening, favored the members with a lengthy report, which contained a number of more or less important recommendations.

He reported that if no more cases of smallpox came from the Indian reserve within a week the danger from that neighborhood would be nil. He reported there were over 7,000 vaults and cess pools in the city, which required more serious attention. He proposed to have more rigid and frequent examinations of dairies and cowboys. He wanted to have charge of the scavengers, so that they would be responsible for the reporting of uncleanly streets.

After some discussion, the committee was handed to a sub-committee, Messrs. Judd, Kirkpatrick and Feeble, to digest and report on the Chief Smith's report. The Police Commissioners must connect the Dundas Park premises with one of the city sewers.

NO HOPE FOR MACEDONIANS

Abduction, Robbery and Murder Are Daily Occurrences, Encouraged by Mohammedan Authorities.

SULTAN STAMPS OUT OPPOSITION.

Christian Life and Property Are Entirely Unprotected—Armenian Atrocities Duplicated.

St. Petersburg, May 6.—L. A. Zinovietz, Russian Ambassador at Constantinople, who arrived here last week to receive instructions as to the Macedonian troubles, says that even in Turkey people have little idea of the frightful atrocities committed in Macedonia. The rebellion has been of the most formidable difficulty in Macedonia. Turkey has a army of 20,000 men on a complete war footing in Macedonia, and is preparing to hold that territory against all comers.

Macedonia is the nucleus of all the troubles that are brewing in the Balkans. By the treaty of Berlin of 1878 the Sultan was bound to introduce, without delay, a number of reforms in Macedonia. The Christians of the province were to receive the same privileges as the Mohammedan fellow subjects. Twenty years have elapsed since the signing of the treaty and not a single move has been made by the Sultan to fulfill his provisions. Christians life and property in Macedonia are entirely unprotected. Abduction, robbery, murder, and all sorts of crimes, encouraged by the Mohammedan authorities. The Christians in Macedonia are suffering from the same distress as those to which the Christians in Armenia are subjected. Macedonia has been left to the tender mercies of the Turk, and even this last Christian rising has been put down with terrible and wholesale slaughter.
