The fact of the matter is, and it is well known, that the cattle for the most part were bought too high in the country, and the logical sequence is that somebody is losing money. Individual cases were cited where the drover had paid 12c per lb. in the country for 18 butcher cattle, averaging around 1100 lbs., and shipped them into the market, where they were sold yesterday for 10½c per lb. The facts are incontrovertible, and need no comment. Practically all lines of cattle were off more or less, but the drop was more marked in the light and heavy butcher class. One good load of 22 butchers, averaging \$50 lbs., sold early in the forenoon at \$11.60, and there were sales of other lots at around that figure. As indicating how slow the trade was, it was stated that, out of 2900 cattle on the market, only \$00 had gone over the scales at 12 o'clock. Later they moved out faster, but trade was very slow thruout. For the very heavy cattle there was no sale, and at three o'clock not an offer had been received for some lots. The total receipts were 159 cars, comprising 2890 cattle, 146 calves, 1447 hogs and 71 sheep.

Milkers and springers were in fairly good demand at practically unchanged prices.

Calves—The calf trade was steady to stronger, the top price for choice stuff being 15c; medium calves, 11½c to 13c, and common calves at from 8½c to 10½c. Sheep and lambs—Choice light sheep sold at from \$½c to 9½c; heavy, fat sheep and bucks at from 7½c to 8½c, and choice yearlings at from 11½c to 13c, while spring lambs are quoted at from 15c to 18c per lb. Practically all sheep now coming on the market are clipped. The trade in heavy, fat sheep is very dull, and becoming increasingly so.
