QUEBEC RESTRICTING EXPORTS OF LIQUOR

LAW EFFECTIVE MAY FIRST

Quebec, Feb. 8.—(By Canadian Press).—No liquor will be exported to other parts of Canada from the province of Quebec after May 1 if he new legislation brought down by

the provincial government today is accepted by the legislature.
One of the officers who prepared the iquor bill stated positively tonight that everything connected with the liquor traffic, including the ex-port, will be in the hands of the commission of five members who will be appointed to administer the act. He said that there would be no export of spirituous liquors to outside Brit'sh Imports for January points. These liquors will be imported by the commission and sold only in authorized depots in the province in quantities of one bottle at a time. "The Quebec liquor commission," he aid, "will not be a source of supply for other provinces. It will import for the needs of consumers in this prov-ince but positively not for export." The same official added that there is nothing that will prevent the export of beer or of wines to outside points, but all such shipments must be made

by express or by the railways, and must be done publicly.

The bill, the provisions of which have been forecasted in despatches from Quebec for weeks, provides for the entire aboutton of the present system of handling liquor in Quebec.
