

HANOVER MISSION

is situated on the boundary between the townships of Brant and Bentinck ; has four appointments, all in good health ; the two weak and prospectively weaker ones of last year having, under the healing power of the Holy Spirit, become convalescent. We have also four M. E. Sunday-schools, promising long life if well used. We are thankful to the good Lord for a noble band of workers and plenty of work. There are on the Mission four chapels and a parsonage, with property worth \$1950 ; and four efficient local preachers in harmony for the work of God. The Lord has given us prosperity. Three new sheds were erected during the year, so that at every appointment there is a good shed for the protection and comfort of horses. Thirty-seven were added to the Church, and some spiritual advancement in the older members is apparent. There is now a membership of one hundred and fifty. All the Conference claims are met, and the missionary himself not forgotten. Though the German element in our midst is strong, there are yet very many English-speaking sinners hungry and dying for the bread of life ; and the work of the Methodist Episcopal Church will not be completed here for many years to come. May the Lord of Hosts lead on to victory. Hallelujah ! Amen.
