OFFICIAL OF A. A. U. REPLIES TO HOFF

Champion's Third Appeal For Cause of Suspension is Answered

BOSTON, June 15.—A third appeal by Charles Hoff, world's champion pole vaulter, for information as to why he was barred by the Amateur Athletic Union from further competition in the United States was answered on Tuesday. William C. Prout, of Boston, chairman of the foreign relations committee of the A. A. U., telegraphed Hoff that he was sending him a letter by air mail. Prout refused to divulge the contents of the letter.

Hoff indicated several weeks ago that he might resort to court action as a result of the suspension that followed his refusal to compete at the A. A. U. meet in San Francisco. He said then that he would send a series of three telegrams for particulars as to the charges against him. The third came on Tuesday and in it he explained that he felt that he should not go back to Norway under a cloud.

"Won't you please wire me what I am barred for and give me an opportunity to defend myself," his message today asked. "I have been waiting here thirty-eight days, since May 6, trying to learn what the charges are against me. This has been very expensive and trying and I feel I should

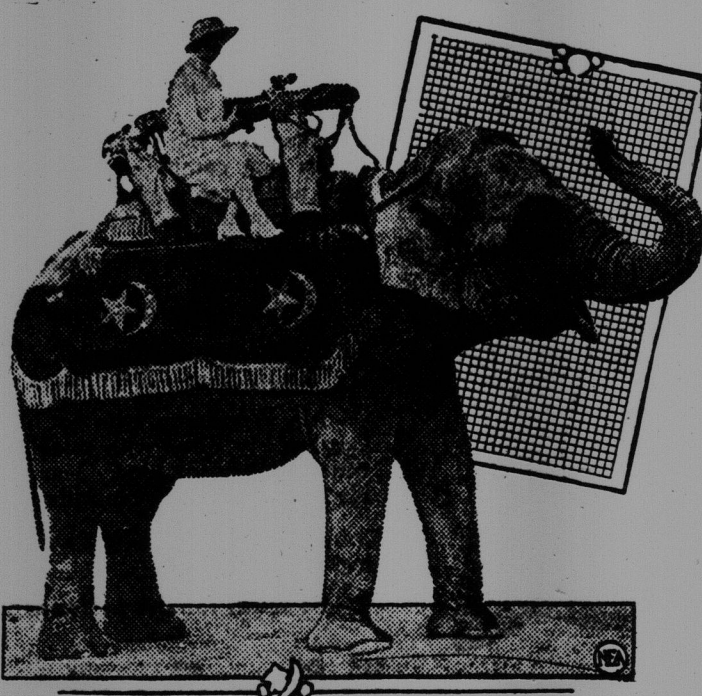

FLOWERS TO MEET FITZSIMMONS

No-decision bout at Boyle's Thirty Acres—Champion Favored

NEW YORK, June 18.—Tiger Flowers, negro champion of the middle-weights, met Young Bob Fitzsimmons tonight in a ten round no-decision contest at Boyle's Thirty Acres in Jersey City.

The Tiger cannot lose his title, for Fitzsimmons is a much heavier man, but a defeat might damage his ring reputation.

CARPENTIER DEFEATED

PHILADELPHIA, June 17.—Tommy Loughran, Philadelphia light-heavy-weight, outpointed Georges Carpentier, French soldier boxer, in a grueling 10-round contest in the Municipal Stadium at the Sesqui Centennial Exposition Grounds tonight.

The judges handed in an unanimous verdict in favor of the Quaker City boxer. A crowd of 30,000 spectators witnessed the fight. A stirring rally in the final round gave Loughran the verdict. Loughran floored the colorful Frenchman with a driving right to the jaw in the seventh round and continued his aggressiveness during the remainder of the contest. In the tenth round Loughran brought blood to the Frenchman's nose with a lightning right uppercut which almost floored Carpentier and forced him to cover up and save himself from further punishment as Loughran strove to follow his advance.
