GIRLS AND BOYS LIVING GAY LIFE

Mothers of Detroit See School Neglected for Parties and Dances.

Detroit boys and girls of high school age are going to too many dances, seeing too many movies, doing altogether too much smoking, drinking, playing, and all too little studying, in the opinion of a number of prominent women who belong to the Detroit Federation of Women's Clubs.

The women are planning for a "come ack to normalcy" movement for young cople, and they are asking federation members to see that their own children are permitted to attend affairs away from home only on Friday and Saturday ween the research of the second evening when there are no lessons to prepare. The new venture has been undertaken by the Civic Department of the Federation, with Mrs. James N. Downey

as chairman.

"We do not want the young people to think we are depriving them of all their pleasures, but we do know that Detroit high school boys and girls are indulging in too much gaiety for their own good," Mrs. Downey says. "I have personal knowledge of boys and girls between sixteen and seventeen who are going to parties two and three evenings a week sixteen and seventeen who are going to parties two and three evenings a week. Why can't they be kept at home on week nights and allowed to have their good times on Friday and Saturday evenings? "No child who has been to a party until late one night is at all fit for school next day. High school boys and girls need sleep, and plenty of it. What they really need
