noon.

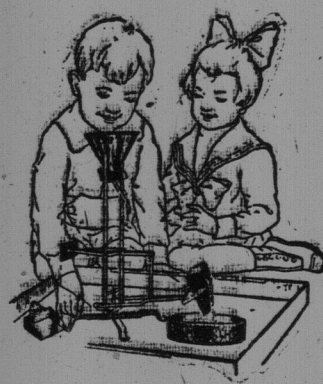

### "BIZZY ANDY TRIP HAMMER"

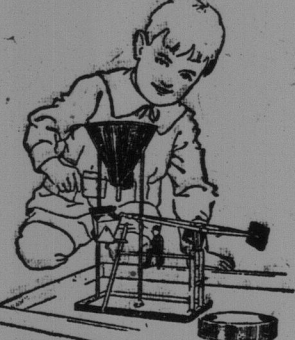

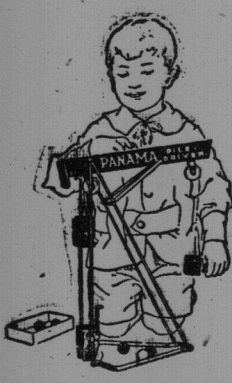
