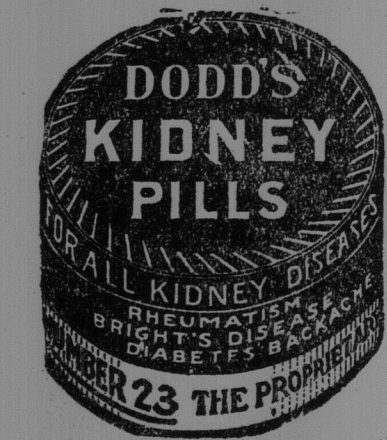

Col. W. H. Franklin, senior officer of the first 500 contingent, presided and those present included Lord Morris, of Bowring, Major Gen. Burnett-Hitchcock and C. P. Fielding, Brigadier-Generals C. Melville and J. G. Ross; Lieut. Col. A. Bernard and B. Burton, and Major Sullivan of the forestry battalion. A message of apology was received from Lord Northcliffe for his absence.

The toast of "brother officers who have fallen" was honored handsly.

Major Timewell proposed "the imperial forces." He referred to Lord Jellicoe's tribute to Newfoundland sailors, and remarked that the dominion was one of the few remaining cradles of actual seamen. He said he was of the opinion that Newfoundland would become a very important port of the globe in regard to flying.

Captain Vaughan Jackson referred to Newfoundland's excellent record of contributing 2,000 men to the royal naval reserve.

Lieut. Colonel Franklin, in proposing the toast to the "guests" hoped that the regiment would not be allowed to die.

Lord Morris of Bowring, said this would be unthinkable after the great name it had made and the suffering it had endured. It was not necessary that Newfoundland maintain a large body of men, but at least the nucleus of the regiment should be maintained for use in the field if the occasion arose.

Plan Denounced As Autocratic

Presbyterians Oppose Participation in Inter-Church World Movement

St. Louis, Mo., May 20.—The question whether the Presbyterian Church in the United States should enter the inter-church world movement, which seeks to ally all Protestantism, delayed for several hours today adoption of the New Era report by the 181st general assembly, in session here, because the report indorses the movement.

Paragraphs of the report pertaining to the movement finally were deleted and the report adopted with the understanding that the question would be brought before the assembly later for action.

Commissioners favoring the movement declared the Entente would not have been victorious over the Central Powers had it not been for the alliance they formed, and advocated that the movement be endorsed so that Protestantism would be strengthened in its efforts to bring about a "super power" to rule the allied religions.

More conservative commissioners then urged that the matter be laid over until next week, asserting that the problem was the greatest before the assembly and needed the utmost consideration, as this is the first great church judicatory to consider it formally.

The New Era report, as adopted, urges that arrangements be made for the care of returning soldiers and sailors, and that positions be found for returning ministers, who served in the war. The report advocates a great brotherhood between employer and employee as a means of eradicating the Bolshevik and the I. W. W., and states that the Church is the most influential society to bring this about. The report also advocates sex equality in church matters.

In the report of the evangelism commission, closer co-operation of the various presbyteries was urged in an effort to make the work of the Church more concrete.
