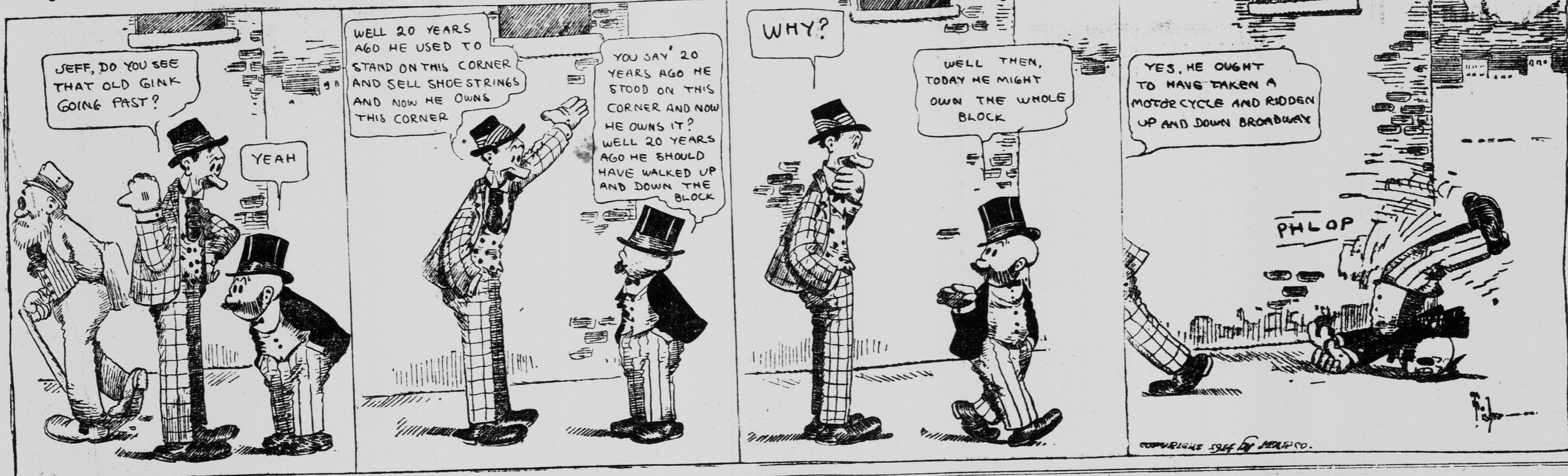

Mantel Not in Moha's Class Now

Milwaukee, May 18 — Bob Moha, a Milwaukee middleweight who seeks honors with the best in that division had a session with Frank Mantel, a New Hampshire 136 pounder, before the National A. C. of Milwaukee recently and won as he pleased, although he failed to stop the easterner. Mantel is an experienced warrior among the middleweights, having met many of the best — among them Jack (Twin) Sullivan, Billy Panker, Jeff Smith, Bill McKinnon and Jack Dillon. He has been good one in his day, but he is past that period when he can battle with the top notchers and hold his own. He did the only wise thing against Moha — fight

and safely protect his jaw—which he did to perfection. Bob landed at will, but Frank always had his arms high enough to prevent a clean wallop reaching the tender point of the jaw, which usually results in a knockout. Moha was strong as a bull and no doubt would have stopped his man had the latter mixed and opened up a bit to take a chance. Bob weighed in at 164 pounds, but he carried about five pounds too much and would have been still faster at about 158, which he can make without trouble. Bob will probably meet Jack Dillon in Indianapolis on May 29.
