CAPTAIN SCOTT AND ALL DIE IN THE ANTARCTIC

British Expedition Overwhelmed By Blizzard on The Way Out

Had Reached South Pole One Month Later Than Amundsen—Many Men of Note Perished With British Explorer—Wife Now on Way to Meet Him

(Canadian Press) Oamaru, N. Z., Feb. 10.—Captain Robert F. Scott and his party were overwhelmed by a blizzard on their return journey from the south pole. The entire party perished.

They reached the south pole on January 18, 1912. The despatch from Oamaru, which sailed on June 1, 1910, for New Zealand and the South Pole, was not joined by Captain Robert Scott until a few days later at Cardiff. The expedition consisted of 28 officers and scientists in addition to a crew of 23 picked men from the British royal navy.

Freight Congestion Reported From Moncton RUSH WORK ON SUNDAY

Minor Accidents Also Due to The Cold—Serious Illness of Mr. Crossman Recalls Noted Murder Trial of 35 Years Ago

(Special to Times) Moncton, N. B., Feb. 10.—The extreme frosty weather of the last few days has played havoc with railroading on the Intercolonial. It has been found impossible to make running time and practically every passenger train is more or less behind time.

While freights on the northern division especially have been run with difficulty, it is reported that the yards east of Moncton are choked with freight which has been unable to move.

Although special trains were kept moving with all possible speed yesterday it is not expected that the Sunday work will more than make a dent in the mass of freight waiting to be moved.

A noticeable feature of the trains which left here yesterday was that many of them were "double headed."

In addition to the delay, several minor accidents attributed to frost occurred here last night and this morning. About ten o'clock last night a Grand West-bound freight special was passing through the city when a truck on a big Erie box car broke down with the result that the car jumped the track and also came to rest on the main line.

The car was loaded with about forty or fifty tons of coal and considerable difficulty was experienced in replacing it.

No. 19 through freight was leaving the city this morning, after a delay of about an hour.

The engine No. 411 a Pacific type passenger locomotive, blew out the head of one of the cylinders with the result that the other cylinders were unable to operate.

COMMISSIONER SCHOFIELD URGES COUNCIL DELEGATION TO OTTAWA

Government Should Complete one Before Next Winter to Accommodate Increasing Business—North and South Wharves Lose in Earning Power—Detailed Report on Harbor Facilities

The following report on the harbor of St. John, for 1912, was presented to the common council today by Commissioner Schofield:

MONTENEGRINS CAPTURE POSITION OF ADVANTAGE AT SCUTARI

Hill Overlooking Eastern Part of Fort—Adrianople Continues

(Canadian Press) Podgoritz, Montenegro, Feb. 10.—The Montenegrin army besieging the Turkish fortress of Scutari carried the great Bardos hill by assault at half past ten o'clock this morning, after some hours of severe fighting.

The infantry men on several occasions came into such quarters that hand to hand fighting was general along the line.

Bardos hill dominates Scutari from the eastern side and the Montenegrins are in a right round the city. The Turkish defenders are on the heights to the west of the city.

Fighting has gone on since early morning with great determination and courage.

In the Derkos district the attempts of the Turks to retake the heights and withdraw to their original positions. The bombardment of Adrianople continues.

MURDERERS TO DEATH CHAIR

Three Die in Sing Sing, Two For Slaying of Woman

(Oswego, N. Y., Feb. 10.—Three murderers were put to death in the electric chair in Sing Sing prison this morning. Two of them were convicted of the slaying of a woman.

The first man to die was Joseph Garofalo, a large Italian. He killed his wife with an axe when she threatened to divorce him.

George Babcock, a negro, small and frail, was the second to take the chair. He was the murderer of a white woman, Mrs. Mary Bell, in Brooklyn, in October, 1912. Best on robbery, he beat her to death with a hammer.

Donald Cardillo, the last to die, was convicted of stabbing to death Stephen H. Brook, a man whose body was found in a brook, almost in the shadow of Sing Sing prison itself.

REBELION REPORTED TO HAVE EXTENDED TO MONTEREY—GENERAL BLANQUET SAID TO HAVE DESERTED MADERO

(Canadian Press) Mexico City, Feb. 10.—According to a Canadian Associated Press despatch from London, published in the Gazette this morning, the Daily Telegraph this morning publishes a startling announcement from a correspondent to the effect that a number of government supporters are taking concerted action to defeat Madero's naval policy.

It says they are anxious to do all in their power to rehabilitate the scheme of Sir Wilfrid Laurier and are working in close association with the Hon. Mr. Fielding who came to this country immediately after the introduction of the Borden naval bill.
