A BASEBALL WAR?

Dallas, Texas, Dec. 15—The two major leagues in raising the option limits from eight to fifteen, deliberately defy the minors and possibly invite a baseball war if the lesser leagues which voted at Louisville to refuse permission for the raise regard the agreement as abrogated. Walter Morris, business manager of the Dallas Club of the Texas League, and former member of the National Board declared last night.

"Most minor magnates feel that the option law is the only thing the minors get out of the present major, minor agreement," he said. "The American League has never signed it but the National has. Allowing major clubs fifteen option players means that the sixteen teams will own 240 players in the minors instead of 128, and these players will represent the cream of the playing talent of the minor field."
