8. (a) Volunteers - Physiological Tests - Instructions were issued for 100 Physiological subjects to report to the CW Laboratories in gps of twenty during Aug, from MDs 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5.
- (b) Leave - Coal Miners - An additional 90 Army personnel (35 in Eastern Canada and 55 in Western Canada) were released for six months to return to the coal mining industry.
- (c) Ontario Provincial Election, 1943 - Arrangements have been made for Reserve Army personnel of the Province of Ontario undergoing annual trg to be released from camp in sufficient time to vote in their constituencies.
- (d) Reports on Capital Offence Overseas - CMHQ instructed that in all cases where soldiers are charged with committing a capital offence an initial report is to be sent immediately to this Headquarters, to be followed by an interim report and a final report on the outcome of the trial.
- (e) Foreign Missions
- (i) USSR - The newly appointed Russian Mil Attache, Col N. Zabolin, has arrived in Ottawa.
- (ii) Yugoslavia - The head of the Yugoslav Mil Mission in Canada has advised that all personnel enlisted to date would be discharged, effective 15 Jul, and placed at the disposal of Cdn Mil authorities.
