It is said that a branch of the "Home and Property Association" has been established in Chinatown. When Mr. Turner recovers after the stroke on July 9th he should be told it was not a mule that kicked him, but the people.

The conviction is gradually dawning upon the public mind that even Mr. Phillips, the campaign singer, will be unable to save the government from universal wreck.

The Colonist professes to believe that the "Progress and Prosperity" committee will win over the "Home and Property Association." But the Colonist don't profess to believe that the people believe what it professes to believe.

Mr. Pilling is said to be practising the "Dual March," which he will sing at the "Progress and Prosperity" committee meeting at the Fort and Broad streets, on the evening of July 9th.

Those who have been promised cabinet positions by Mr. Turner in return for support will experience considerable difficulty in delivering the goods after July 9th.

Mr. McPhillips made a violent attack on Hon. Joseph Martin in his address on Monday night. Mr. Martin was not present to defend himself. Mr. McPhillips is a brave man, a lover of his country, and a man of high character. He takes this method of showing it.

The Revelstoke Mail puts the thing in a nutshell. The government has maintained itself in power by a rotten distribution of patronage, raising of the British flag, and indifference of the electorate. The people are now roused, however, and like an angry man ready to rend his prey, will take at the ballot boxes on July 9th. The whole country is up, and the "Big Four" will push the mainland hard for the tropics of victory.

Vancover returns four members, District No. 1 (four ridings), four members, and New Westminster City, one member. Total number of members returned by lower ridings of British Columbia is 9. Number of "Independents" nominated, 8; number of straight government candidates, 1; and of those who are not candidates, 1. The Hon. J. H. Turner, premier and finance minister, who is now in Victoria, his home being in Chilliwack-Columbia.

Referring to the meeting recently addressed at the Revelstoke by Hon. Mr. Turner and Mr. Cotton, the Revelstoke Mail says: "The Premier's speech can best be described as disappointing. It was the same old story that has done duty so long, and it was delivered in only fair tone to say he suffered from a cold and was unable to deliver it in a more manly manner. The impression was not good, and he had not well started before the people began filing out. When he had long past his time, the audience was reduced to less than one-half. It was purely a defensive speech, not a speech of attack. He admitted the retention of the tax on miners, though admitting it a hardship; he did the same on the mortgage tax, admitted it was a hardship, but he said the government must have a revenue. His allusion to his action on the river bank question was very weak, and he meant the impression to be made of him that he was a fraud to argue it, who questioned relating to it got quite unnecessarily irritable. On the financial railway policy of the government he dwelt long but to no purpose, as the audience grew smaller continually. He grew tiresome at last and did not resume his seat until he had been asked to do so by the audience, who, after the chairman, did not like to interfere before out of respect to his position. Premier Turner is a speaker."

Mr. F. C. Cotton received a regular ovation as he faced the audience in reply to the attorney-general. He sarcastically named the "law-maker's" speech "wasp and toothpick" and sympathized with the government candidate in not having received a platform. He at once named the "Progress and Prosperity" party and showed the government were losing money on all their railway enterprises, as in the Nakusp & Slocom, where a private company got the best of it when the government took the cost. He ridiculed the other schemes, among them the Yukon-Cassiar, and arraigned the recklessness of the government in a stern manner. On another he took up the miners' tax, the mortgage tax, land policy and redistribution questions and named the ministers without gloves. He interspersed his remarks with stories apropos and fairly captured the audience's sympathy. He concluded a realy and a speech by a request to the government policy, he had waited long and travelled far to hear it. Mr. Kellie replied to Mr. Turner and though very late the meeting insisted on hearing him. He called in the premier with gusto on the inequality of taxation and discrimination against our miners in favor of coal and coal mines. He pointed out the inequality of representation and other matters chargeable to the present government, and reproached the premier as a weak man. His denunciation of the government was in the extreme and was received with thunders of applause. On resuming his seat he was greeted with "three

cheers for Kellie," and the singing of "He's a Jolly Good Fellow." Did you say you would like to talk about annexationists, "Arty?" Does anybody know what Harry Helcken was talking about last night? It is simply ridiculous charging Dunsmuir with wanting the earth-it's the island.

Another "Big Four"-James Dunsmuir, J. Dunsmuir, Jim Dunsmuir and Mr. Dunsmuir. Quit growling and thank God that the Dunsmuirs have permitted us to remain on this island so long.

Vote for your homes-not for Dunsmuir or Turnism or British Pacific, or the "Home and Property Association," or anything of that kind. Turner will never make use of the expression "my government" again, anyhow; Dunsmuir would have something to say about that.

The following order has been posted up in the various "progress and prosperity" clubs: "Give Joe Martin a good kicking. He should be done down by fair means or foul. Stop at nothing." It may soon be necessary for the residents of Vancouver island to approach the Dunsmuirs and request them to remain over night. In view of the possibility of that occurring it would perhaps be wise not to be too hard on the Dunsmuirs.

Mr. McPhillips's exhibition of heroism on Monday when he so boldly attacked Hon. Joseph Martin the latter gentleman, who in Vancouver has called forth many complimentary references. Mr. McPhillips' courage is only exceeded by his desire to serve his country.

Clayoquot, B. C., June 24.-S.S. Wilapa brought the rival candidates to Clayoquot on her last trip, and considerable amusement was caused by the hurried departure of the government candidate on the same boat, owing to a very cold reception accorded him. Two well attended public meetings were held on Wednesday and Thursday, and after addresses by the remaining candidates and after his having replied to a number of questions, both meetings unanimously agreed to support Mr. Neill. If the reports we receive here from the other parts of the district, from well authenticated sources, are to be relied on, there can be no doubt whatever that the opposition party will secure a large majority in this constituency.

Says the Rossland Leader: "That is a pathetic appeal published in last night's Leader from the farmers and miners of Alberta. It is an appeal from men suffering under the most iniquitous form of social tyranny and legislative injustice to help them from under the yoke. The Nelson Tribune has the following synopsis of the speech delivered by Mr. Cotton at the meeting at Nelson in reply to Premier Turner: "Mr. F. C. Cotton then came on the platform and was greeted with cheers. He said he was greatly disappointed to find, as he had often been before, that by meagre information afforded him by a man cannot make an orator without breaking eggs, much less can he do so without any eggs to break. He had confined himself to ancient history, and said very little on the points which were under discussion. There was no vital to the electors. These were no declarations of policy on which the electors might decide. Mr. Turner had spoken of the planks of his platform, but he had not named any. Any government of modern government, whether one-sided or not, must have policies, judges and the like. The railway policy of the government was enough to condemn it. The government had practically built the Nakusp & Slocom railway, and then given it away, and all the profit goes to the company. By means of the government not arranging for short and long haul rates it merely got the proportion of the haul of 36 miles to the haul of 3,000 miles to eastern points. In the Yukon West, British America had been given away for nothing, and had been transferred by the C. P. R. to another company. The C. P. R. had also got a subsidy of \$11,000 per mile from the Dominion. The Mackenzie-Manitoba deal was also in any way. It was extortionate, and was not referred to and been made to the redistribution bill which gave the electors of West Kootenay and East Kootenay the right to vote for the one-fourth of the Lillooet and Esquimalt. Mr. Cotton proceeded to give figures, but they were not given. He was substantiating this. When the government went on to point out that the mortgage tax pressed on the poor man and did not touch the rich, and was in effect a dual tax. He then referred to the Chinese question, and to the fact that the government were always opposed to restricting legislation. The finances had been grossly mismanaged, and borrowed money applied to what should have been paid out of revenue, and still the deficit increased, and that notwithstanding increased taxation. He then read J. L. Retallack's platform and

showed that it was an opposition platform, and commented on the fact that there were hardly any straight government candidates in the Dominion. He said that he and Joe Martin stood shoulder to shoulder. The opposition had stayed out 24 hours to get a proper distribution bill. In answer to a question, he stated he would be in favor of a tax on Chinese employees could be legally passed.

There seems to be an inclination on the part of some people to be a little too hard on the Dunsmuirs. This ought not to be. The Dunsmuirs haven't got much—the third of Vancouver island, a railway, a few steamboats, two or three coal mines, and several million acres of mineral lands and a few other trifles. The Dunsmuirs ought to have a little show in this country. And their interests should be looked after. The Dunsmuirs can hardly be blamed for wanting a sufficient contingent in the House to safeguard their interests. Don't be too hard on the Dunsmuirs.

Mr. Bryden is holding his own and cornering the market, because he is taking precious good care not to let his opponent, Mr. Heller, know when his meetings are held. The Dunsmuirs on the other side of the story should be told. He is evidently afraid to meet his opponent on the platform and discuss the situation with him. Mr. Bryden knows full well that he has a desperate part to play in trying to get the most votes, and he will not unless he cannot possibly help it, have any meeting where his defence of the late miserable government can be torn to pieces. The New Westminster Columbian says: "The government has been very successful in its dealings with railway companies. It has given the L. & N. Railway Co., for 73 miles of road, 1,800,000 acres, embracing the most fertile soil in the province. It has given between 250 and 300 square miles of the richest coal areas in the province to the British Columbia Southern (C. B. & S.) Railway Co., retaining only a royalty of 5 cents per ton on the coal mined. The Columbia & Western was given 200,000 acres of land on the condition of building a railway from the Columbia river to Penticton. The Nelson & Fort Sheppard was presented with 100,000 acres of land, and the Dunsmuirs on the other side of the road for its entire length of 60 miles. In addition to squandering the public heritage in this manner, some of these companies have obtained large money grants from the government. Thus, on the one hand, the government has been throwing away the most valuable assets of the country, and on the other, it has been piling up the debt of the province to enrich a few railway promoters."
