



Rice as a vegetable—Soak one-half cup of the rice over night. Cook in veal broth until grains are soft. Make a sauce with two tablespoonfuls of butter melted before the fire, two small teaspoonfuls of flour, pepper, salt, and one large cupful of rich milk. Cook it until creamy and add it to the rice. Pour all into a dish, cover it with crumbs and bake it until brown A la' Yokchama—Take one cup of boiled rice, the same of white sauce and one-half cup of minced tongue. Mix all together lightly. Place it in a baking dish, cover it with grated cheese, and bake until it is well brown ed on the top. Serve hot.

With Tomatoes—Soak one-half cup rice in cold water over night. Next morning put in double boiler and add fresh boiling water, and a pinch of salt. Cook until soft, without stirring. Take a cupful of stewed fresh temato and flavor it with supar, pepper and salt, ticken it with butter and flour, mix it lightly with the rice and bake it in the oven.

Sweet Dessert—Put boiled rice into a mold and set on ice for several hours. Turn out on platter and surround with whipped cream, Decorate with the rice and marsh.


