OMAR KHAYYAM WINS BIG RACE IN KENTUCKY

English Bred Colt First in 43rd Annual Derby, at Churchill Downs.

Louisville, Ky., May 13.—Omar Khayyam, imported from England and carrying the colors of Billings and Johnson of New York, won the forty-third renewal of the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs Saturday afternoon from a class field and before the largest crowd that ever witnessed the important event. The imported Marco Lisma colt carried 117 pounds and ran the mile and a quarter in 2:04.35. This is the richest stake for three-year-olds in America and was worth \$15,000 to the winner.
Andrew Miller's Ticket, favorite in the betting, was second, two lengths back, with a length and a half separating J. W. Parrish's Midway in third place. Harry Payne Whitney's Rickety was fourth, four lengths behind, with the early pacesetter, Star Gaze, in tenth place.
