ga, about a mile below the wharf. The "France" was about two-thirds loaded with general cargo, principally grain, for Liverpool. She was chartered in England by Messrs. Allan for summer traffic.

She sank in less than ten minutes after stiking on the Island. A horrible accident occurred to the Engineer of the tug "Rocket," sent to
