MONTECAL, June 13. Steamship "France," 2,480 tons, and drawing 22 feet 6 inches water, went down outside the harbor this morning. She had cleared for Quebec and was to sail for Liverpool Saturday.

She was accompanied by a pilot but in passing late Rhode suddenly struck heavily. Concussion was so great the vessel reeled, nearly capsizing. About three minutes after striking she righted and drifted with the current nearly running down the Longueuil ferry steamer.

In the meantime the vessel was fast filling with water, and in a few minutes she sunk in 25 feet of water, opposite Hochelaga, about a mile below the wharf. The "France" was about two-thirds loaded with general cargo, principally grain, for Liverpool. She was chartered in England by Messrs. Allan for summer traffic.

She sank in less than ten minutes after striking on the Island. A horrible accident occurred to the Engineer of the tug "Hockey," that was to aid of the steamship "France." The man was sent down into the paddle wheel to adjust something, when the wheels suddenly revolved, literally tearing him to atoms.
