GIRL'S ONE PIECE DRESS.



The thing about this dress which will be sure to appeal to the home dress-maker is that it is very much simpler than it appears at first glance. It is cut in one piece from shoulder to hem, with a cordlike closing at centre front. A large sailor collar of the same on contrasting material finishes the neck. The most interesting feature of all is the belt arrangement, which is cleverly cut in one piece with the saddlebag pockets. Either the long or the three-quarter sleeves may be chosen. The girl's one piece dress pattern, No. 8338, is cut in five sizes—8 to 14 years. The 8 year size requires 3 1/2 yards 27 inch, or 3 1/4 yards 36 inch material, with 7 1/2 yards of bias.
