

#### LACHINE ENLARGEMENT. CANAL

#### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned, endorsed "Tender for Lachine Canal," will be received at this Office for the enlargement of this Canal, consisting of the widening and deepening Lock, upwards to the river St. Lawrence at Lachine; mbracing the construction of a new lock at Côte St. Paul, taking down and rebuilding the upper portions of the present lock at that place, construction of regulating weirs, enlverts, bridge piers, and a new channel and basin on the south or river side of the existing outrance.

tions of the present look at that place, construction of regulating weirs, onlyerts, bridge piers, and a new entrance lock at Lachine, and the formation of a channel and basin on the south or river side of the existing entrance.

The works will be lot in sections of the respective lengths indicated on a map of the line, which, together with plans and specifications of the various works, can be seen at this Office, and at the Lachine Canal Office, Montreal; at either of which places printed Forms of Tender can be obtained.

Tenders for Section No. 9, or what is called the Rock Cat,' and Section No. 10 at Lachine, will be received until the arrival of the eastern and western mails, on Wednesday, the 12th day of January next, plans and specifications for which can be seen at the idea of January next, plans and specifications for which can be seen at the respective places above mentioned on and after Wednesday the lift day of January next.

For other parts of the works, tenders will be received until Theesday, the 21st day of March next, and for which plans and specifications can be seen at the respective places above mentioned, on and after Theesday, the 7th day of March.

Contractors are requested to bear in mind that Tenders will not be considered unless made strictly in accordance with the printed forms, and—in the case of firms—except there are attached the actual signatures, the nature of the occupation and place of residence of each member of the same; and further an accepted bank cheque, or other available security, for the sum of from one to three thousand dolders, according to the extent of work on the secution must accompany cent Tender, which shall be forfoited if the party tendering declines or falls to entor into contract for the works when called upon to do so, at the rates stated in the offer submitted.

The almont required in each case will be returned to the rospective parties whose Tenders are not accepted.
