not at all clear. Patients with A.R.C. do not necessarily progress further with the illness, while some remain in stable condition, others improve, and only 15% go on to develop overt AIDS. Symptoms of A.R.C. include malaise, fever, night sweats, extreme weight loss (10%), diarrhea and fatigue. Patients displaying these symptoms are often regarded as "especially affected" by the AIDS agent, although not necessarily AIDS sufferers.

Finally, there is overt AIDS. Since there is no diagnostic test for the disease, physicians recognize certain opportunistic infections as indications that the disease is present. By breaking down the body's immune

system, the AIDS virus allows these infections, called "marker" diseases, to easily take control. The two most common marker diseases are KAPOSZ's SARCOMA, a form of skin cancer, and PNEUMOCYSTIS CARNII, a severe form of pneumonia.

Although studies are still being done to determine the ways in which the AIDS virus is spread, it is agreed that the two most likely means of transmission are in semen and blood or

blood products. To date there is no definite evidence that saliva can carry the disease, although this possibility is still being considered. AIDS cannot be spread through casual social contact of any kind.

Although the AIDS Virus is thought to be carried in the blood, the possibility of developing AIDS after receiving a blood transfusion is only about one in five thousand. The Blood Transfusion Service of the Red Cross Society

takes special precautions to screen all donated blood for AIDS antibodies. Although the AIDS virus itself is not yet detectable, antibodies in the blood are an indication that the donor has been exposed to the disease. All blood used in Fredericton is screened in St. John before use.

According to Dr. Bocci efforts are being made to

organize a type of patient screening clinic in Fredericton. This clinic will consist of a panel of experts whose job it will be to examine possible AIDS cases, and decide whether they should be sent away for further testing in Halifax. It is hoped that this service will provide a fast, efficient method of identifying possibly dangerous cases, thereby ensuring the protection and tranquility of the Fredericton community.
