Dear Mr. Meighen:

I am almost ashamed to write you but if I do not you will think that the Conservative Party in this province has gone out of existence, since we allowed two elections in Halifax to go by.

I wrote you fully with reference to the When Finn resigned a new Attorney General Dominion election. was appointed and not likely he will be opposed in Halifax. The truth of the matter is that we had not a good man to oppose him. One man, Felix Quinn, is very popular with his confreres and personally he is a great friend of mine, and he would have run, but I felt that Quinn was too good a man to be sacrificed and I could not see that we would have such financial assistance as to be able to put on a good campaign. Quinn is a soda water manufacturer and I know that his Bank would immediately come down on him, as in addition to the cost of the election a few of us would have to financially assist him in the Bank. the exception of W.A.Black, who was willing to do his share, there was no hope of putting a campaign on that would spur our men to future work even if they were beaten.
