Dear Mr. Morgan:

I am sorry indeed to have delayed writing you after having had the advantage of a talk with you as long ago as the 16th November. As you are aware, I have been absent almost continuously since. I had the matter, however, noted for attention and would have written you today in any event.

May I express the hope that any difficulties that have arisen in the County of Sorel are on the way to removal and that our friends there will unite for the good of the cause and against the Government, which is beyond all doubt so mismanaging public policy as to seriously impede progress in this country. You have had the advantage of long experience and I feel sure that the electors there will recognize the value of this experience, especially in matters of organization and preparations for the contest.
