

to enable him to do so. Communication
 however, is being had with the Agents
 of the Department, and through them
 with the Indians who were parties
 to the respective treaties of 1800 and
 1806, who I will, it is hoped, throw some
 light on his search after the question,
 and enable him to arrive at a rational
 satisfactory conclusion which will be
 communicated to you.

In the meantime, the Superintendent
 General suggests that the timber on
 the Island covered by the Agents
 license as far south as the Pine Point
 including Moon Island, should be
 managed and the dues there collected
 by the Officers of the Department.
 Mr. Wright will be advised that the
 Superintendent General has authorized
