

I enclose you to do so. Communication  
 however, is being had with the Agents  
 of the Department, and through them  
 with the Indians who were parties  
 to the respective Treaties of 1800 and  
 1806, who I will, it is hoped, throw some  
 light on his conduct after the question,  
 and enable him to arrive at a rational  
 satisfactory conclusion which will be  
 communicated to you.

In the meantime, the Superintendent  
 General suggests that the timber on  
 the Island covered by the Agents  
 license as far south as Thomas Point  
 including Moon Island, should be  
 managed and the dues there collected  
 by the Officers of your Department.  
 Mr Wright will be advised that the  
 Superintendent General has authorized
