Gentlemen,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letters of the 26th and the 29th ultimo in which you make application on behalf of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company for two tracts of land containing together 5.23 acres in the Caughnawaga Indian Reserve to be leased for a period and for a strip of land containing 2.73 acres and an extra width on the Easterly side of the right of way of the said Railway in the said Reserve, and that the said Company desired immediate possession of these lands.

I have to say that on the receipt of a deposit on account of \$500.00 your Company may enter into possession of the said lands for the purposes required, with the understanding that compensation both for the lease and for the extra width will be determined and paid for with the next despatch. Mr. Letourneau, Assistant Indian Agent, St. Constant, Quebec, will then be instructed to permit the said lands to be used on the reserve for construction purposes.

In reply to your enquiry I have to say that it is desirable that the plans should be certified by a Quebec Land Surveyor and referred to your letter of the 26th.
