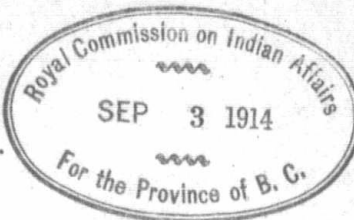

Ottawa, 28th August, 1914.

Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant, in which you enclosed copy of letter received by you from the Provincial Game Warden of British Columbia, and also of a letter covering the transmission of copies of the said letter to Indian Agents throughout that Province.

The Department regrets that, as shown by the correspondence, the Indian Agents neglected to communicate to the Indians under their care the information given them by the Game Warden, and with which it is important they should be in possession. It is hoped that the letter sent by you by direction of the Royal Commission on Indian Affairs will have the effect of causing the Indian Agents to recognize their duty in regard to this matter.
