up for inspection by the farmer, who must see that every detail is in readiness for the seed-time now here.

Sows with little families should have dry, clean, and warm quarters, and care taken to preserve the little pigs from any accident from care-

lessness on the part of the old one.

To have healthy young lambs, ewes should have gentle exercise, and be in good condition before coming in. Good, early-cut clover hay will furnish an abundance of milk—with beans, oil, meal, oats, and shorts as additional food. Warm, dry apartments are as essentially necessary as food, and without them there is no chance of success in rearing lambs.
