CLYDESDALE. A country post office on Paudash creek (which supplies power) not yet utilized, in Chandos township, Peterborough County, 52 miles north-east of Peterborough, the county seat and nearest bank location, and 11 from Coe Hill, on the C O Ry, the nearest railway point. It contains Methodist, Catholic and Presbyterian churches, and common schools, and ships timber, logs and iron ore. Weekly stage to Peterborough, fare \$2.25. Population, 100. Mail weekly. COBDEN. A village on Muskrat lake, and on the C P Ry, in Ross township, Renfrew County, 20 miles south-east of Pembroke, the county seat and nearest banking point. Settled in 1844. It contains Episcopal, Presbyterian and Methodist churches, and a public school, and ships grain and live stock. Stages daily to Eganville, Brudenell and Combermere, fares \$1.00, \$2.00 and \$3.00 respectively. Population, 500. Telegraph, G N W. Express, Dominion. Mail daily. John Delahey, postmaster.
