

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion ands in Manitoba or the North-west ritories, excepting š and 36, which has not en homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood ta for settlers, of for other purposes, may be mesteaded upon by any person who is the le head of a family, or any make over 18 ars of age, to the extent of one-quarter sec-n of 100 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Eutry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Lecal Agent for the district in which the land is situated agent for a situation of the situation of the situation author is in situation of the situation of the A fee of \$00 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provision of the Dominion Lands Act and the sumer_gents thereto to perform the conditions cornec "of therewith, under one of the following plans.-

At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if this father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make deceased or any person who is eligible to make the second second second second second second the second second second second second second second the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by "sch person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon' the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 30 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his ontry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.
