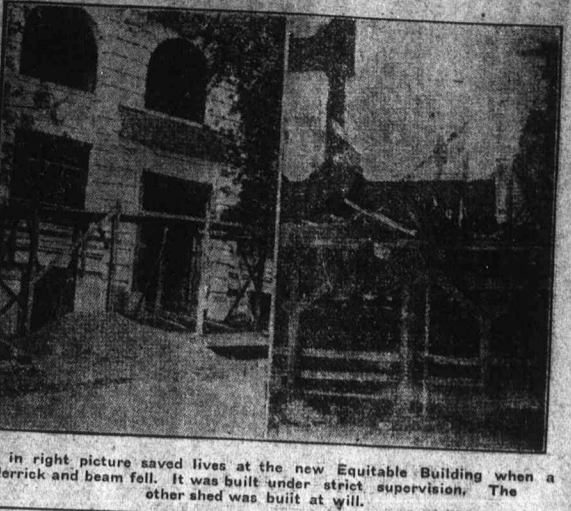

IMPORTANT FIRES DURING THE WEEK

Twenty Thousand Dollar Cash and Door Factory Fire in Cartierville, Incendiaries Believed to be at Work in Montreal.

ONTARIO—Belleville, June 15.—Engine house of Imperial Oil Company, badly damaged. Fire started on top of wagon loaded with oil.

Milton, June 15.—C. P. R. grain sheds and six thousand bushels of wheat destroyed by fire which started in the roof.

Wooler, June 14.—Fire broke out in Temperance Hotel and spread to dry-goods store of Lacey Brothers and the Murray Tavern. All three buildings were burned to the ground.

Kingsville, June 15.—Fire destroyed large brick house owned by Westcott & Wright. The building contained an outfit for fish fishing. All was destroyed. The loss is estimated at \$14,000, partly covered by insurance.

Perth, June 15.—Barns of R. E. Wilson, on the Scotch line near Perth, were destroyed early on Friday morning. Also several surrounding heavy horse sheds. The loss is estimated at from \$15,000 to \$18,000, partly covered by insurance.

Toronto, June 15.—Two fires which occurred in the Police Iron Works on Sunday did damage to the extent of \$20,000. The first fire occurred in the blacksmith shop, and the second fire was due to defective wiring, due to damage in the first outbreak.

London, June 14.—Fire caused by a defective coal oil lamp did considerable damage to the residence of Mrs. Noble, 604 English St. The flames, which spread, caught her clothing, and Mrs. Noble was severely burned.

Grimby, June 17.—Fire at midnight swept the plant of the Consumers' Lumber and Box Company, doing damage to the extent of \$25,000. The ground was practically burned to the ground, despite the efforts of the village fire brigade. Over \$7,000 worth of new machinery, installed within the past few days, was destroyed. Insurance amounts to \$12,000.

Toronto, June 18.—Damage amounting to \$11,000 was done to the contents of a three-story warehouse at 106 Front street east, by fire last night. The fire did not last an hour, the contents of the building suffering from the fire and smoke.

Quebec, June 15.—Considerable damage was done by a fire which was discovered at 4:25 in the plant of the Church and World Soda Company, at 22 Brennan street, on Friday. The fire was discovered by a passer-by, who turned in an alarm from the box at the corner of Duke and Brennan streets. The source of the fire is as yet unknown, but it is supposed to have originated in the engine room.

Montreal, June 15.—Fire destroyed house at 53 Marquette street and in the blaze started in the shed in the rear of the house, in which 50 gallons of coal oil were stored. Two horses were burned to death.

June 10.—Twenty thousand dollars' damage was done in a fire which occurred in the cash and door factory of Jasmin and Cantin in Cartierville last evening. The building, which was a two-story structure, was completely destroyed. The loss is covered by about five thousand dollars' worth of insurance.

Montreal, June 17.—Fire which started in the hay and grain shed at the corner of La Salle avenue and Notre Dame St., destroyed ten tons of baled hay; the building was not seriously damaged.

Montreal, June 19.—Fire which broke out in the warehouse of Messrs. Corneil and Joly, charcoal merchants, on Herbyville street, did damage to the extent of several thousand dollars yesterday. Besides several sheds, a large quantity of bagged charcoal was burned. A McCaffrey, from \$1,250 to \$1,500; J. Deguire, from \$1,250 to \$1,300.

Quebec, June 18.—The store and private residence, with dependencies, of St. Rose, Beauce, were destroyed yesterday. The loss amounts to \$6,000, and the insurance to \$4,000.

NEW BRUNSWICK—Moncton, June 15.—The house owned and occupied by John W. Collins, was burned last night. The loss is estimated at over \$3,500.
