**MONTREAL.**

Montreal, April 5th.

The market is very interesting just now. The  
milk creamery are beginning to increase  
in another week they should be a consider-  
able making down prices. At the moment, dealers  
are selling at 27 to 28c., according to quality and  
creamery being 25 to 26c. for choicest, and 23  
grades. There is very little held butter  
present appearances, dealers will have no  
trouble of it all, before the new milk goods

cheese a slight movement in old market cheese at  
according to quality, while fodder makes have  
3c. here. It is said that the latter is costing  
more.

Demand for eggs was very active at Easter.  
The quantity had apparently been held back  
in expectation of higher prices. These were  
not met and the demand being insufficient to ab-  
sorb the supply experienced a sharp decline. From 23 or  
24c. the market quickly sagged to 17 and 18c.  
to-day. Dealers claim they are buying at  
14c. and that they will buy at 14c. next week.  
to pickle when the cost here is 15c.

There is an unusual demand for seed this year  
in addition the meadows are in after the killing  
prices are \$4.50 to \$7 per 100 lbs. Montreal;  
according to quality; and \$15 to \$16 for alsike;  
for red clover, and \$14 to \$20 for white

Sheep skins are still \$1 each; horse, \$2 for No.  
1. Beef hides are 10, 11, and 12c. per lb.  
and 1, respectively, and calfskins, 13c. for No.  
1, per pound.

Wheat.—The weather has not been very favor-  
ing this spring. The weather has improved  
now as though there should be a free run.  
Merchants claim they are selling syrup at 6½c.  
per gallon, and sugar at 10c. per pound.

Their market is firmer, owing to lighter sup-  
ply and white stock is costing about 65c. per  
cwt. and white, 70 to 75c. It is being turned  
back, at about 3c. more, and bagged and de-  
scribed in a jobbing way, at 10 to 15c. more.
