And be it enacted, That from and after the Sixth day of May next, and during the continuance of this Act, there shall be levied and paid on all Hemp and Chain Cables, Anchors, Cordage, Canvass, Sails, Rigging, Blocks, Pitch, Tar, Oakum and Copper, imported into this Island, the sum of Two Pounds ten shillings on every One hundred Pounds worth thereof, in lieu of any Duty imposed upon the said Articles by the herein-before recited Act.
