After Foaling-P, A.—'How soon after toaling should a young mare be bred? How soon should she be worked? What age should she be when bred the first time. Ans.—If the mare does well and does not have to work too hard she can raise a colt each year from three years on. If carefully handled the mare will not need to reet more than 2 weeks. Many mares raise fine colts which are not given any rest after foaling.
