CANADIAN FARMS
FOR SOLDIERS
1000 To Be Set Aside For Use
After War
One thousand farms will be
set aside in Western Canada by
the Canadian Pacific Railway
for the use of soldiers discharged
after the European war. Ac-
cording to an announcement
made today by Lord Spangham,
the farms will be ready for
occupation in the spring of next
year. They will be grouped in
colonies with appropriate mil-
itary names. A general instruc-
tion manual under a competent
superintendent is part of the
scheme.

The general principle of pre-
paration will be similar to that of
Shanklin's previous scheme
of ready-made farms in British
and New Zealand and has been
recommended by Mr. E. Wood
read for the settlement of areas
reserved in the Western part
of the United States.

LESSTARD PRAISES THE
HIGHLAND BRIGADE
Canada's Foremost Soldier Says
They Are a Splendid Body
of Men
(Morning Chronicle)
Major General Lesnard, C. B.,
Inspector General of the Can-
adian Forces, arrived in Hal-
ifax from Aberdeen last night,
where he had been inspecting
the Highland Brigade. Seen
at the Halifax Hotel last even-
ing by a reporter General Les-
nard spoke very highly of the
brigade, strongly commending
the Nova Scotians for their gen-
eral appearance and efficiency.
"A splendid body of men in
one of two of the battalions
are above the average in Gen-
eral Lesnard's opinion, and a
unit of men of which to be
material throughout the whole
brigade was a quality to in-
crease when they have their
training for the front.
Although he did not want to
make any invidious compar-
isons, General Lesnard did how-
ever speak of the 55th as being
one of the best of the brigade
of the Nova Scotia. The
brigade as a battalion ex-
ceedingly efficient and setting a high
standard. This same standard
will be attained by the whole
brigade.

General Lesnard is admitted
to be Canada's foremost
professional soldier. He has
made a life study of the art of
war, and served with great
credit and high distinction dur-
ing the South African campaign.
Recently he has been reported
that General Lesnard last night
to visit the Highland Brigade
The Morning Chronicle reports
that report was true. General
Lesnard said: "I have not yet
before, but I have watched the
Government that when they

vice I am ready to retire." He
said that he was in no position
to discuss the matter.
Referring to the present ser-
vice and the prosecution of the war
generally by the Canadian Gov-
ernment, Lesnard was asked
"Do you think that we should

a good thing if it would protect
industries, and send to the front
men who are fit to go."

"What is it you hear about
territorial organization?" asked
the reporter.
"Terronally," said General
Lesnard, "it is not to be
splendidly rendered by
units or by different battalions
sent to their countries, because
by being indiscriminately pro-
posed their identity is lost.
Therefore, the units of the com-
mand in which they were raised,
with the result of lack of ex-
perience in recruiting inter-
changeable units."

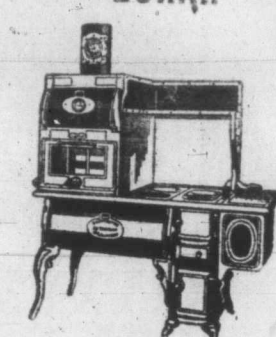
"As to the Province of Quebec
I believe," said General Les-
nard, "that eight or ninety per
cent would be willing to have
recruitment I believe that there
would be a general enthusiasm
in that Province if help could

BRITISH CAPTURED LARGE
NUMBER OF GERMS
London, Oct. 18.—The British
official communication, issued
at midnight, says:
"There is little to report from
the battlefield, except of the en-
emy shelling Ghentcourt and its
neighborhood and of the enemy
counter-attacks in the Tiber valley
area, which we severely handled
and repulsed."
"Between July 1 and Septem-
ber 30, besides large quantities
of other war material, we cap-
tured from the Somme battle-
front 25 heavy guns and heavy
howitzers, 82 field guns and field
howitzers, 102 trench mortars,
pieces and 307 machine guns."
