OBITUARY

CAPT. SAMUEL McBRIDE
In the death of Capt. Samuel McBride, which occurred on Wednesday April 25th at his home in Harborville, Kings Co., the community loses one of its aged and most upright citizens. Capt. McBride sailed seas until about thirty years ago, when he retired from sea-faring life and settled on a farm he had purchased in Harborville. He was a strong, healthy, robust man until about three weeks ago, when he was taken down with a severe attack of grippe, and despite medical skill he passed away at the age of 83. He leaves a large family: Emma, (Mrs. Connor) who lived with him; Mrs. William Caldwell, Yarmouth; Mrs. Boyd Parker, Harborville; Capt. Chas. McBride, Waterville, Kings Co. at present at sea; William, a member of the Town Council at Kentville; Auber, George and Fred, in the States. Mrs. McBride died many years ago.

PTE. WM. BROOKE DIED IN A GERMAN PRISON

Serving 12 Years' Sentence - Refused to Work in Munition Factory.

Ottawa, April 28 - Private William Brooke, son of Mrs. C. J. Brooke, 251 Metcalfe Street, who was captured by the Germans at the first battle of Ypres, died in a German prison early in March according to notification received by his mother last night. Private Brooke was undergoing a twelve years' sentence in solitary confinement imposed by the Huns following his refusal to work in a munition factory. The young hero, who was in his 23rd year, was in New York studying art with a friend when war broke out and hurried back to Canada to join the colors.

NOVA SCOTIANS GUILTY OF BIGAMY

Rev. Ernest Harris and Mrs. Gertrude Wambach, Arrested at Kitchener, Ont.

Kitchener, Ont., April 28 - Rev. Ernest Harris, who claimed to be an Anglican minister, and Mrs. Gertrude Wambach, who have been residing in Hespeler, since last November, and were arrested on charges of bigamy pleaded guilty before Judge Hanning in the Criminal Court yesterday. Sentence was reserved for one week Wambach, the husband of the woman, who lives in Nova Scotia, was in court and expressed a desire that the pair be justly punished. Harris is also married and has a wife and family living in LaHave N.S. Harris has been engaged in the insurance business since residing in Hespeler.
