

************************ CONSTITUTIONAL STRUGGLE

Responsible Government in The Territories

The triumph of responsible government in the North-West Territories was achieved fifteen years ago after a long seige and conflict between Mr. Haultain and his supporters in the North-We t Assembly and the various governors who would not account to the Assembly for the annual expenditure, thus denying their responsibility to the people's

representatives. This constitutional struggle at last resulted in a deadlock, speaker Ross having resigned, taking his place on the floor of the House where he advocated the principle of the responsibility of the Governor and his advisory council to the Assembly. The Deputy Speaker Mr. Sutherland also resigned and the dead-lock was complete. Through the death of Mr. Reaman a vacancy was created and a Haultain supporter returned. This gave the people's party a majority and on Christmas day, 1891, Lieut.-Governor Royal summoned Mr. Haultain to Government House where he w s called upon to form the first responsible government of the North-West Territories.


