

Sidney Lobb Out on Bail. NARANO, July 30. —Sidney Wentworth Lobb, whose wife was found dead in bed on bail of \$5,000. The preliminary hear-ing of the case has been constantly delayed at the request of the Crown prosecutor. It was understood that the proceedings on Saturday would be final, but Magistrate Plata apparently does not wish to assume any jodicial responsibility in the matter. He announced that now that Mr. Lobb should be released on bail it was his intention to remand the case from week to week until the November assizes, when accused could appear. This is tantamount to a committal for trial, but the evidence is apparently considered as alight that the magistrate has adopted this method of allowing Lobb his freedom.
