> INTERNATIONAL EIBLE LESSON FOR TO-MORROW.

Jesus' Power to Forgive-Mark 2. 12. Read Matt. 9, 28; Luke 5, 17-

Golden Text-The Son of Man hath power on earth to forgive sins. In the last five verses of Mark 1

Jesus is described as touching and healing a Jewish leper and directing him not to tell a soul about it, but to go at once to the priest, be examto go at once to the priest, be examined as to his being healed and offer, as the law of Moses prescribed, for his cleansing; otherwise they were both quarantined by Jewish law—see Lev. 14—but the man disobeyed Jesus, and He was without in desert places for several days. In this lesson He is back in His own city, and the common people, leaders in church and mon people, leaders in church and state, flock to see, to hear or to be healed of Him

Verses 3 and 4—Four friends of a paralyzed comrade carry him on his sleeping mat to Jesus that He might heal him, but the jam was so great they could not get near Him; but wherever there's a will there's a way—those who are determined to reach Jesus Christ always get there—they take the outside stair to the roof and soon lower their helpless friend to the feet of Jesus.

needed a change of heart, through the forgiveness of his sin, worse than he needed to be changed in body and restored to health. First things put first, and Jesus forgave him his sins, calling him son, while he was so paralyzed he never uttered a word of confession heard by mortal ear.

Sin is the tap-root of suffering; it were useless to remove the conse-quences of sin unless Jesus came to the sin-sick soul.

To Jesus' critics He was but a

man, and as none but God can for-give those who sin against Him, Jesus by this act was claiming God-head, which , from their standpoint. was blashemy and worthy of death. He saw their blind hearts as He saw the faith of the four and the heart of the paralytic.

could forgive, and to prove He had authority as God to forgive sins, He said, arise, take up thy bed and go unto thy house, which he at once did, and went forth before them all, insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, "We never saw it on this fashion."
