WHY ROUMANIA HAS ENTERED THE WAR.

Roumania declared war on Austria Roumania declared war on Austria-Hungary on Sunday evening, it is an-nounced here officially. The announ-cement follows. The Roumanian Gov-ernment yesterday evening declared war on Austria-Hungary. The Feder-al Council has been convoked for an immediate sitting.. The motive which prompts Roumania to enter the war is the satisfaction of her national as-nirations, described by Take Jonesus s the satisfaction of her national aspirations, described by Take Jonecus, Roumanian Liberal leader, as the policy of national instinct. Concisely, this means national expansion in the southern half of Bukowina, the Austrian crown land. The Roumanians are the dominant race; the mass of the people of Eastern Transylvania, a part of Hungary, is Roumanian by race and language. It is said 4,000,000 Roumanians live in Transylvania. Roumania has been credited with a long cherished ambition to annex

these provinces and at the same time liberate the Roumanians now under Austrian domination. It recently was reported that Russia had offered Czernovitz to Roumania as a reward if she would unite with the Entente Allies. Roumania also covets Bessarabia, the extreme southwestern province of Russia on the Black Sea, which was taken from her by the which was taken from her by Berlin Treaty of 1878.
