



AUSTRIAN OFFICIAL.

VIENNA, June 24. (Official.) Austro-Hungarian troops evacuated Montello and the right bank of the Piave River. A position has arisen by difficulties connected with changing to the other bank, our movements remained unobserved by the enemy. Many lines already evacuated were subjected yesterday to strong Italian gun fire, increasing in places to drum fire. The enemy infantry also advanced to attack against the trenches we had abandoned, but were driven back by our long-distance batteries.

TANKS IN ACTION.

BRITISH HEADQUARTERS IN FRANCE, June 23. (Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency.)-Last night tanks ing operations near Bucquoy and proved satisfactory, penetrating the enemy lines unhindered and returning safely. Their mission was partly to beat down a path for the infantry, in which they were successful. They also aroused considerable machine gun positions. Our progress as a result was restricted to the eastern margin of the Bucquoy cemetery. The enemy heavily shelled the Strazell rail way where his attempt to raid our

FORTIFICATION VOTE.

WASHINGTON, June 24. The \$5,408,000,000 fortifications bill was passed to-day by the House by a record vote after only five hours debate. It now goes to the Senate.

ONE BIG DEMOCRACY.

LONDON, June 23. (Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency.)-Premier Lloyd George speaking at don, urged that we must prepare for peace. The world must be fit for everybody and all classes to live in. There should be no room for deformities such as militarism, mammonism and anarchism; all must have a fair share. Thee future of the Empire has already been committed to democracy, he said. Problems of reconstruction must be arranged in an atmosphere of brotherhood and friendliness. The upper classes, middle class, the lower classes have all passed through the flery furnace together and it has changed the hearts of the people. Before the war I fought hard to get fair play for the people from whom I sprang, and what I got was by fighting. I am going to try another way this time.

THE NAVY OF BRAZIL.

LONDON, June 23. (Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency.)-Admiral Francis Dematters, Chief of the Brazilian Naval Mission to Europe, in an interview, said that the navy of Brazil was already doing patrol work with the Anglo-American fleets guarding the transport of foodstuffs for Brazil. When war broke out, he said, fifty-three German ships were interned in Brazilian ports, of which thrity-three, aggregating 250,-000 tons, had been ceded to France. He predicted victory for the Allies by next year.
