Where do Days Begin? APPARENTLY THE POINT IS SOMEWHERE

THE PACIFIC OCEAN. Where do the days begin? They must

begin somewhere, and by a clever line of argument a writer in an English weekly figures out that the place where the days begin lies somewhere in the Pacific Ocean. A straight line does not define the place, but it runs zigzag among some of the islands scattered over the broad expanse of water.


