The Order being read for the consideration of the Message from the Senate informing this House that the Senate doth insist upon their amendment made to Bill No. 107, An Act to confirm the Order in Council of the twenty-fourth day of February, 1919, prohibiting the Importation, Manufacture and Transportation of Intoxicating Liquors, and the Order in Council of the twelfth day of April, 1919, in amendment thereof;

Sir Robert Borden moved, That a Message be sent to the Senate respectfully requesting a free conference with their Honours to consider the said Bill, and any amendment which at such conference it may be considered desirable to make thereto.

And the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The House then resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Meighen: That the Bill No. 166, An Act to constitute a Board of Commerce for Canada, be now read a second time.

And the Debate continuing;

FRIDAY, 4th July, 1919.

And the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, and progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again at the next siting of the House.

By leave of the House,

Mr. Calder, for Sir Robert Borden, moved for leave to introduce Bill No. 178, An Act to amend the Dominion Elections Act, which was read the first time and ordered for a Second Reading at the next sitting of the House.

By leave of the House,

Mr. Meighen moved that Bill No. 179 (Letter A4 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Margery Berridge Grey," be placed on the Order Paper this day for first reading and that rules 25, 28A, 96, (subsection 3), and 115 be suspended for that purpose, which was agreed to.

By leave of the House,

On motion of Mr. Boys, the said Bill was then read the first time.

By leave of the House,

Mr. Boys moved that the said Bill be now read a second time.

And the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read a second time and referred to the Select Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills (together with the evidence, etc., taken before the Standing Committee of the Senate on Divorce on the petition on which the said Bill was founded).

The House then adjourned at 1.15 a.m.
