CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS—PENSIONS

Mr. Knowles:

1. How many employees now working for the Canadian National Railways are making payments toward a supplemental pension in addition to the basic pension of \$25 per month to which they will be entitled on retirement at age 65?

2. How many employees now working for the Canadian National Railways will be entitled on retirement, according to their present status, to only the basic pension of \$25 per month?

Mr. Chevrier:

1. Contributors to C.N.R. pension plan, 35,267; contributors to I.C.R. & P.E.I. provident fund, 5,462; contributors to G.T.R. superannuation and provident fund association, 23.

2. There is no record of the number of employees who on retirement will be entitled to only the basic pension of \$25 per month. Approximately only one third of eligible employees are contributing to a supplementary pension.
